# 1. Erasmus Building (A)

- Opened in 1963, oldest building on campus
- Auditorium for lectures, events, and ESE graduation ceremonies
- Erasmus Gallery with a permanent and changing exhibitions
- Erasmus statue and *Jan Tinbergen*'s Nobel Prize on display

# 2. Theil Building (C)

- Large lecture halls, self-study areas, and a coffee corner
- Named after *Henri Theil*, an important figure in the development of econometrics

#### 3. Tinbergen Building (H)

- Under renovation until 2026
- Named after *Jan Tinbergen*, the first Nobel Prize winner in Economics

#### 4. E Building

• Main support centre for Erasmus School of Economics: information desk, study advisors, lecturers, and staff

#### 5. Sports Building

- Training and competition facility with 50+ sports
- Used by students, staff, and top athletes for workouts and team sports
- Also open for lunch or coffee

#### 6. Sanders Building (L)

- Home to Erasmus Student Service Centre and IT Helpdesk
- Visit for enrolment, documents or study support
- Also houses the Erasmus School of Law

#### 7. Tinbergen Plaza

• Square with supermarket, convenient for groceries between or after lectures

## 8. Mandeville Building (T)

• Home to the Institute of Psychology and Rotterdam School of Management

#### 9. Van der Goot Building (M)

- Mainly used for exams
- Named after first Dutch woman with PhD in Economics

## 10. V Building

• Temporary building with small lecture rooms

#### 11. Erasmus Plaza

• Social hub with food outlets, café *In de Smitse*, hairdresser and bike shop nearby

# 12. Polak Building (Y)

- 900 quiet study spaces
- Smart, energy-efficient design

# 13. Langeveld Building

- 3,000 study spots and green indoor areas
- Structure supported by tree trunks and plants
- Named after Rotterdam's first female professor, *Henny Langeveld*

# 14. Hatta Building (U)

- Student housing for international students, shared flats and studios
- Named after *Hatta*, founding father of the Republic of Indonesia and alumnus of Erasmus School of Economics

#### 15. Erasmus Pavilion

- Place for coffee, lunch, or events
- Theatre and lounge for EUR honours students
