

Who are cities for?

On the Right to Housing and Sustainable Just Cities Insights from a Movie Night with "PUSH - The Film"

Access to adequate housing is a basic human right, but a global increase in housing price is making it difficult for people to live in cities. In this blog, we share the insights on the global housing crisis and the right to housing that were learned from the movie night with "PUSH-The Film".

Globally, the price of housing is increasing at a much higher rate than that of income. Housing in today's world has become a financial asset rather than a place for people, families, and communities to live together. The resulting housing crisis is a breach of the basic human right to housing and a threat to just sustainable transitions in cities as it essentially makes living in a city impossible for many people.

We believe that there is a need to increase awareness of the housing crisis and create knowledge on alternative approaches to tackle it. However, notions of 'sustainability', 'justice', 'cities', 'transitions', and 'right to housing' are vastly complex and interconnected, and discussions about these can easily turn into an abstract academic exercise. This is why in June 2020, we organized a screening of "PUSH - The Film" on the housing crisis, followed by a [World Café](#) group discussion to share knowledge and connect ideas.

The [movie night](#) was the first in a series of online events to engage people with the theme of [sustainable and just cities](#) with focus on tangible urban challenges (e.g. housing, energy, mobility, health). This event focused on the basic [human right to housing](#), that aims to provide vulnerable citizens access to adequate, safe, and affordable housing. It was organized by the [Vital Cities & Citizens](#) initiative, in collaboration with the [UrbanA](#) project on just sustainable cities and the [Dutch Research Institute for Transitions](#).

Housing has become the largest expenditure for many households who now find it difficult to live in cities where they work. However, the housing crisis affects people differently and disproportionately. For example, certain socio-economic groups are more vulnerable to health risks during the Covid-19 pandemic than others due to the lack of affordable housing. [Leliani Farha](#), the former UN Special Rapporteur for Right to Housing and Director of [The Shift](#), formulates the urgency of the situation as: "Housing has become the front line defense against the coronavirus. Home has rarely been more of a life or death situation" ([OHCHR, 2020](#)).






- Improving quality of life & well-being
- Meeting needs of both present & future generations
- Enabling justice & equity
- Living within ecosystem limits.

What is environmental justice?

- Beyond inclusivity, equality & equity
- **Distributive** justice
(e.g. equitable distribution of material resources & services)
- **Procedural** justice
(e.g. participatory & democratic decision-making)
- **Recognition** justice
(e.g. recognizing historical context & culturally inclusive practices)
- (many other dimensions)

Types of justice

Explanation

Distributive justice

The classic liberal foundational concept of justice, which highlights inequities in the distribution of (material) goods.

Procedural justice

A well-established aspect of the social justice concept, which focuses on who is involved, and how, in decision-making processes

Recognition justice

A more recent, but well-established, notion of justice that recognizes a notion that there are many ways that certain individuals and groups can be included or marginalized due to ethnicity, race, gender, sexuality). Being able to overcome systemic exclusion, generates recognition justice

Hermeneutical justice

When vulnerable residents are engaged in the creation of safe/healthy/welcoming spaces, allowing their experiences to be expressed and accounted for (even if it is not in traditional scientific, political, or social language)

Epistemic justice

When local knowledge and perceptions are valued and taken into account (i.e. of space, local ecology, social factors that affect health -otherwise known as environmental epidemiology).

Testimonial justice

When past, historical experiences (of violence, discrimination) in a specific neighbourhood or place are taken into account

Responsibility justice

Recognizes and addresses the restrictions of "responsibility" projects, due to their potential impacts on (economic, cultural, racial, gender) realities.

Imaginary and historical (in)justice

When new urban imaginaries are erasing visible spaces cared for by long-term residents, and making invisible past injustices while causing new exclusion

Intersectional justice


Recognize the multiple (gender, class, ethnicity, etc.) dimensions of challenges lived and interpreted in space, through time, and while making sense of place (processes).

Relationality-inspired justice

Spaces of care and connection, with attention to gender-specific social needs, but also different types of connections and care for nature.

Embodying Alternatives to Capitalism in the 21st Century

Abstract: The goal of this article is twofold. First, to illustrate how in the last decade a growing number of critical and Marxist thinkers committed to discussing and developing theories of change have started to broaden their focus by including social movements and grassroots initiatives that are “interstitial”, i.e. initiatives that are developing within capitalism and are striving to prefigure a post-capitalist society in the here and now without engaging in contentious, violent and revolutionary actions and activities. To achieve this, I mainly focus on the work of four authors: Erik Olin Wright, John Holloway, Ana C. Dinerstein, and Luke Martell. The second goal of this article is to understand why these interstitial movements are getting so much attention from critical scholars and to argue that the time is ripe for establishing a theory of (and for) prefigurative social movements. The article closes with some brief reflections on the future of radical thinking that includes an invitation, directed mostly at the young generation of critical and Marxist scholars, to begin a dialogue with theories of change developed within other disciplines, to engage with activists, and to experiment with participatory methods and techniques.

Prefiguration

- Prefiguration: “live and strive to reproduce in the present the kind of society we envision for the future” (Monticelli, 2018: 509-510)
- ...“embody their ultimate goals and their vision of a future society through their ongoing social practices, social relations, decision-making philosophy and culture” (ibid: 509)
- “not only opposing capitalism but also prefiguring post-capitalist societies. These movements are re-thinking and re-politicising conventional modes of production, consumption and living by defending, restoring and creating spaces of resistance and experimentation” (ibid:515)




